What This Standard Means

Children should enjoy a rich and fulfilling life filled with activities they love. This standard ensures they can take part in meaningful hobbies and explore new interests, building confidence, friendships, and a sense of achievement.



What Staff Must Do

- ✓ Plan activities that match children's individual interests
- ✓ Encourage participation in sports, arts, play, and community life
- ✓ Help children try new things and celebrate every achievement
- ✓ Support friendships through shared activities



What the Registered Manager Must Do

- ✓ Offer a range of enrichment opportunities inside and outside the home
- ✓ Ensure funding is available for activities and outings
- ✓ Monitor participation and gently encourage new experiences
- ✓ Make sure activities reflect each child's age, interests, and needs



What the Responsible Individual Must Do

- ✓ Set aside a budget for meaningful recreational activities
- ✓ Oversee and review how well the enrichment programme supports growth
- ✓ Ensure variety, inclusion, and access across the activity programme



Staff Development

- ✓ Supporting children's self-esteem through hobbies and achievement
- ✓ Planning inclusive and meaningful enrichment
- ✓ Encouraging healthy friendships through shared experiences



Inspection Preparation

- ✓ Keep clear records of planned activities and participation
- ✓ Be ready to share how children benefit from what's offered
- ✓ Children may be asked what they enjoy and how they're supported
